Student Characteristics

At Fallibroome, we deliberately seek to develop three key characteristics in our students:

Kindness

We want our students to be kind to each other at all times. We encourage them to be helpful and supportive to others; to be considerate and open minded; and to be welcoming to visitors or new members of our community.

Appreciation

We encourage our students to appreciate and acknowledge the many advantages that they enjoy by virtue of being part of our school. We also expect them to recognise the achievement of others and to be willing to openly recognise and celebrate excellence when they see it. At the same time, we actively encourage them to acknowledge the small actions that many others do on their behalf that might otherwise go unnoticed.

Commitment

We expect our students to work hard in lessons and to do their best at all times. Our school behaviour expectations are built on the principle that lesson time is precious and must not be wasted. At the same time, we actively encourage our students to participate fully in our extensive extra-curricular programme and to take every opportunity to represent the school in this way.

Students who consistently demonstrate the highest standards with respect to these characteristics are invited to become a Student Leader. We have about 80 Student Leaders in every year group who can be easily identified by the badge illustrated above. These students act as role models for others and represent the school in key events throughout the year.





Behaviour

At Falllibroome, we believe that each student's time in school is a 'once in a lifetime' opportunity for them to acquire new knowledge, develop new skills and thereby reach their full potential.

This means that we protect the quality of our learning environment with meticulous care. As a result, we simply do not allow lessons to be impeded by any unruly or off-task behaviour. We achieve this by being quick to intervene with minor issues as this avoids any such problems escalating into more significant confrontations later.

In short, this means that Fallibroome has very high behaviour expectations. However, our school culture is not oppressive or overbearing in any way. On the contrary, it is exceptionally rare to hear any member of staff having to raise their voice in order to manage behaviour. We simply assume that our students will meet our behaviour expectations and we are quick to remind them of this when necessary.

We also devote similar levels of effort to recognising and celebrating positive behaviour as much as possible. We use a range of stickers, postcards, displays and certificates throughout the year to encourage and support students who are doing their best. We also have a series of high-profile Awards Evenings at the end of the year for each year group.

The clarity and consistency of our approach to managing behaviour has created a highly respectful learning environment that allows positive relationships to flourish across the school. By virtually removing negative behaviour from our school, we have created a safe, supportive and exceptionally positive learning environment for everyone.

Curriculum

The key aim of our curriculum is the development of 'subject expertise' in our students. We define this as a combination of:

Subject Knowledge: We believe that there is a set of core content in each

subject that our students need to learn and remember. We have consequently been very careful to plan this core knowledge very carefully and to make this as

accessible to students and parents as possible.

Subject Skills: Having secured the key subject knowledge in their

long-term memory, we then ask our students to apply these concepts to a variety of tasks and challenges of increasing complexity. In this way, our students are given the opportunity to demonstrate their subject expertise in a variety of creative and challenging ways.

We have also been careful to structure our curriculum to ensure breadth and balance by offering a wide variety of subjects from Year 7 to Year 13. It is an important point of principle for us that students should encounter a range of opportunities at KS3 and thereby find their passion and interests in their early years with us. We have then deliberately structured our options processes at KS4 and KS5 to maximise student choice so that these interests can be pursued right through to A-Level whenever possible.

Pastoral Care

Fallibroome prides itself on providing outstanding pastoral support to ensure that all students feel happy in school and have someone to turn to if there is a problem.

Each student is placed in a tutor group of approximately thirty boys and girls. The Form Tutor's role is to get to know the children properly and to ensure that everything is going well on a day-to-day basis. The Form Tutor is the first point of contact for parents when there is concern about the progress or welfare of any student.

Each year group from Year 7 to 13 has a Head of Year who is responsible for monitoring the progress and welfare of students and for supervising the work of the individual Form Tutors.

Our Student Support Services provide additional pastoral care for our students. The provision is built around three centres:

- The Service Centre offers pastoral support to all students during the school day;
- The Behaviour Centre offers support to students who are facing problems with behaviour;
- The Inclusion Centre offers support to students who may find school difficult on an emotional, physical or social level

Students who are struggling with mental health issues can also access additional support from our on-site professional counsellor.

There are many opportunities for students to develop their skills whilst at Fallibroome, whether that be through joining clubs and teams, or through applying to take part in a variety of voluntary programmes, such as our Student Leaders, Year 10 Peer Mentors or Year 11 Student Ambassadors. Students in Years 7 – 11 are also invited to apply for election to the Community Council.

Transition

We aim to make the transition from primary to secondary school as smooth as possible for our new pupils and the strong links we have with our feeder primary schools enable us to maintain continuity and progression in our curriculum and to help students to settle when they arrive in September.

Some key events take place during Year 6 to further aid this transition:

New Intake Day

All students from both feeder and non-feeder schools are invited to spend at least one day with us during the summer term preceding entry into Year 7, in order to experience a typical working day at Fallibroome.

Performing Arts Intake Day

Year 6 students are also able to visit us for a sample a day focusing on the Performing Arts.

Non Feeder Intake Day

Students joining us from a non-feeder primary school attend Fallibroome for a further morning to help foster friendships and gain familiarity with the school.

Fallibroome staff routinely visit primary schools and deliver sessions that offer a flavour of what lessons at secondary school may entail.

Early in September of Year 7, we run a very successful residential trip to an activity centre. This helps students to build new friendships as they work together on a series of exciting challenges.

Communities

Fallibroome is keen to develop 'the whole person' and an important part of life at the school are our four 'Communities', providing students with the chance to take part in fund raising activities, competitions, Sports Day and a wide range of other exciting events. Students will belong to one of four Communities – Red, Blue, Green or Yellow each led by a Community Manager and supported by Sixth Form students.

Students in Year 7 – 11 can also apply to be on the Community Council. This important body provides an opportunity for students to develop their leadership skills, make a significant contribution to the school community, present ideas about how the school could be improved to the school's Senior Leadership Team and work with students from our feeder primary schools.

Support & Challenge

We want all our students to enjoy the new challenge of secondary school and to have the opportunity to embrace new experiences within an exciting, vibrant and caring atmosphere.

Our academic curriculum provides the foundation of literacy and numeracy skills to ensure students are well equipped for the future. Individual pathways are developed for some students if it is felt this will be more beneficial for them. Students are encouraged to participate in regional and national events, among them being:

- the UKMT Senior, Intermediate and Junior Maths Challenge
- Music for Youth
- the Siemanns Roller Coaster Challenge and Lego Robotics Competition



Junior Masterchef

- the VEX IQ RObotics Competition
- the National Connections Theatre programme
- the annual 'Alan Turing Cryptography Competition' run by Manchester University
- Local and regional debating competitions

In Year 10 students are able to participate in the Duke of Edinburgh programme. In addition, we have an ongoing Work Related Learning programme to ensure students are fully informed about making career choices.

The Library is an essential centre of learning, with a team of librarians who ensure that reading is promoted across the school and that the library is available and open to our students before and after school for quiet working, access to computers and completing homework.

Special Needs

We have an excellent Special Educational Needs and Disabilities department. Our team of Teaching Assistants are very experienced and provide first class support to our most vulnerable students. We pride ourselves on including all students in the life of the school as much as possible. All of this combines to ensure that our SEND students make excellent progress whilst at Fallibroome, often exceeding that achieved by their peers.

Extracurricular

Fallibroome offers a wide variety of activities which provide opportunities to enrich the formal curriculum, and support the underlying values and attitudes that the school promotes.

The Performing Arts provide pupils with opportunities to learn from the experience of being involved in concerts and productions where the expectations are that the standards achieved will be comparable to those on a professional stage. With a long and prestigious

history in the Performing Arts, we are able to offer a very extensive range of high quality experiences, including those on a national and international platform, which include music and theatre trips abroad.

Our support for extra-curricular sport is also exceptionally strong. Schools' Sport Magazine regularly rank us in the top 25 state schools in England for the breadth and quality of our sports provision. This is testament to the talent and commitment of our students as well as the exceptional quality of our PE department.



Other clubs and activities are also available throughout the school. For example, we have large numbers of students completing Duke of Edinburgh challenges at Bronze, Silver and Gold levels; our robotics teams have competed in national competitions; and our Art Club is very popular. Whatever your interests or aptitudes, there is something at Fallibroome for you to get involved in at lunchtimes, after school, and during the holidays.

September Information and application packs are made available

for parents by the Local Authority, inviting a parental statement of preferences of secondary school.

October Preference forms are to be submitted to the authority

by the given date.

January The school advises the Local Authority of the criteria

to be used for each application, which will inform

the allocation process.

March The authority advises parents whether their

application has been successful and informs

unsuccessful applicants of their right of appeal.

1.30pm Period 4


2.35pm Period 5
